

## Most Forgotten Items during a Move

### 1. Records

Medical & Dental Records - request copies of your medical and dental records. Also remember to transfer any prescriptions. Do not forget any veterinary records of all your pets.

School Records – These are usually required when enrolling in a new school.

### 2. Hidden Items

Remember to find all items you hid around the house. This includes extra keys, garage door openers and all items packed in the attic and crawlspaces.

### 3. Phone Lists/Address Book

You may think you will remember frequently dialed phone numbers but after being in your new location for awhile you may find that you have forgotten them. If you have phone list on your refrigerator or another reference for your phone numbers remember to take that with you.

### 4. Cleaners

Clothes dropped off to the dry cleaners need to be picked up. Return all movie rentals, library books and anything else that needs to be returned.

### 5. Change of Address

Remember to carry your new address with you in the stress of moving it is easy to forget something such as a zip code and be sure to give it to friends and family members who will want to contact you. Do not forget to change the address on all magazine subscriptions, credit cards, and the post office.

### 6. Cleaning Supplies

We recommend leaving your cleaning supplies out handy for the final clean up before you leave the home. For ease, use up previously opened cleaning products and dispose of the empty containers when you leave.

## 7. Garage Door Opener/Appliances

Remember to remove the garage door opener from your car if you are leaving it for the new owners. Any appliance instructions and warranties that you have saved should be turned over to the new owner if those appliances are staying with home.

## 8. Pets/Plants

Do not forget to make moving arrangements for your pets and plants. Most moving companies do not take these living things. Plan ahead and make arrangements for their safety.

## 9. Deliveries/Pick Ups

Stop all deliveries to your home of newspapers, bottled water, or anything else that is picked up or delivered and billed to your account.
